## **Course Description:**

Through this course students will gain a general knowledge of the different parts of the theatre. Through this class students will have an appreciation for all parts of the theatre from playwright to stage crew to actor and audience member.

### Materials:

### **Expectations:**

#### Due Dates:

## Cheating:
